Did you know that SEAAEYC is a registered Child Care Resources and Referral (CCR&R) hub for Southeast Alaska? Our goal is to assist local and new families with finding child care while providing a variety of resources and trainings to child care professionals. These include the child care apprenticeship program (a first of its kind in Alaska), associate credentials, mentorship opportunities, and annual conferences.

Throughout 2024, SEAAEYC has also focused on equipping parents and caregivers with tools to help them thrive. Initiatives such as Parents as Teachers, Imagination Library, Parent Bulletin, Circle of Security trainings, and many more have successfully helped families feel more connected and supported within our community. These efforts to uplift families and strengthen the child care industry align with our mission to provide high-quality learning and empower all who supports our community's children.

Child Care Apprenticeship Program

The SEAAEYC Apprenticeship Program hosted a wonderful event at the Hangar Ballroom last October. Dr. Randi Wolfe from ECEPTS spoke at the event about the big picture of the need for more early childhood apprenticeship programs and highlighted the success of this program's model. Apprentices spoke on a panel about their experiences as part of the program. During the panel, one apprentice stated, "This program has definitely changed how I interact with both children and families. I've learned to approach children with more patience and understanding, recognizing that their behaviors are often rooted in their developmental stage rather than intentional actions. Instead of just managing behaviors, I now guide children through their emotions, helping them build self-regulation and communication skills."

This is the first cohort of childcare apprentices in the state! They will be graduating with an Occupational Endorsement Certificate in Infant and Toddler Development from UAA in May.



Her research interests center around young children's experiences on the land and how those experiences influence children's relationship with Land.

During her two part Keynote Address, Dr. Lunda will describe global perspectives on early childhood identity development through environmental exploration and how we can incorporate sustainable and culturally responsive strategies to early learning.
