In addition to the fun run, our community came together in a big way by purchasing a whopping 685 raffle tickets—WOW! Thanks to your generosity and support, we are thrilled to share that the event and raffle combined raised a total of \$11,500, all of which will go directly toward book purchases and mailing costs for the Imagination Library.

## **Childcare Apprenticeship Program**

Congratulations to our apprentice team for graduating with an Occupational Endorsement Certificate in Infant and Toddler Development from UAA! Each apprentice completed 18 credits in early childhood education and over 2,000 hours of on-the-job training. We are so proud of their hard work, dedication, and amazing growth throughout the program!

Our apprentice program is designed for success. Modeled after ECEPTS, a highly successful program in California. We provide online learning opportunities with a peer cohort, free tuition and supplies, mentoring, on the-job-training, and reflective supervision. Apprentices work a total of 30-40 hours per week at local childcare centers, with a starting wage of \$20/hr. We have opened the application period for the Childcare Apprentice Program!
